The HEART Robotics Project has developed several key outputs to enhance the skills of educators in adult education through robotics. These outputs include a comprehensive database on educational robotics, offering a wealth of information and resources.

Additionally, there's an online training course tailored for educators, designed to impart essential skills in robotics education. Based on this the partners carried out a training for trainers in Turin, Italy, which prepared them to support the direct target groups for the use of these results.

The project also features webinars that showcase the essence of our project, webpage, database, enlightening case studies, and invaluable training modules.
